Luke 2:1-20 (KJV)

¹And it came to pass in those days, that there went out a decree from Caesar Augustus that all the world should be taxed.

²(And this taxing was first made when Cyrenius was governor of Syria.)

³And all went to be taxed, every one into his own city.

⁴And Joseph also went up from Galilee, out of the city of Nazareth, into Judaea, unto the city of David, which is called Bethlehem; (because he was of the house and lineage of David:)

Eight ways we can view the New Year and every year as:

A Year of:

Christmas Eve Candlelight Service

Service begins at 6:30 PM - Cookies, beverages and fellowship to share afterwards.

Session Highlights

Devotion: Pastor George Doyal, Moderator. Reflection on how photographs and television showed a banner hung across the street in Ferguson during the rioting which said, “Peace”. Would things have been different if it instead had the words, “Peace of Christ”? “The peace of God, which passeth all understanding, shall keep your hearts and minds, through Christ Jesus.”—Philippians 4:7.

Deacons: Deacon representative was invited to meeting by Session. Deacons feel they would like to discontinue hand washing as prelude to Communion as they believe it is wasteful of water during water rationing. Deacon written guidelines call for them to hand pieces of bread out. Session recommended Deacons not touch the bread. Session voted to discontinue hand washing and instructed servers not to physically hand the bread element to members of the Congregation during Communion. Deacons were reminded they can ask past ordained Deacons to assist in serving Communion. Deacon expressed concern about limited range of LifeLine reception when outdoors and away from base station. Junki Kitahara will research LifeLine options for out of the home and report findings/recommendations to the Session.

Clerk’s Report: Lynn Gunter. Membership changes. The present Book of Order does not have a category called “Inactive” member. El Estero had 80 members in “Inactive” status and 76 in “Active” status prior to the Book of Order change. According to the new Book of Order our church would be considered to have 156 “Active” Members. The church is assessed Per Capita for “Active” members. The Stated Clerk of the Presbytery, Rev. Kelso, had advised our Session that churches are allowed to maintain an “Inactive Member” category and enforce their policy. Under the old Book of Order, Inactive Members are not allowed to Vote at Meetings of the Congregation or serve in office or as a Member at Large, A Session vote is required to move a member to “Inactive” status and again when restoring a person from the “Inactive” to “Active” membership. Session voted to authorize Clerk of Session continue to maintain an “Inactive Member” category as spelled out in the prior Book of Order and with the same stated prior restrictions. Church Corporation. Don Chin. Expenses for the month exceeded income by about \$5,000. The Presbytery has set the PerCapita assessment at \$31.50 per member in 2015. The church will be expected to pay for 76 Active members. Attendees can contribute a donation to the assessment by Presbytery.

Administrative Branch: Building & Grounds: The outside stairs will be removed in January. Worship Service will be held downstairs in the Fellowship Hall until the stairs are rebuilt with appropriate inspections. Session voted to authorize purchase of carpeting for 2nd floor areas, stairs and entry up to \$12,000. Yvonne Han and Dori Chin will select and negotiate on behalf of church. Hisao Yamanishi can consult on purchase. Locksmith made repairs to all locking mechanisms on the front doors to the church and they now close and lock securely. The locks to the doors required changing. **Church Nominating Committee:** The committee met several times, reviewed the recommended qualities of officers as stated in the Bible and Book of Order and came to an agreement on Nominees. Session voted to call a Congregational Meeting for the Election of officers on December 28, 2014 at which time the proposed 2015 Church Budget will be shared. **Finance Committee:** Church Budget for 2015 will be shared at the Congregational Meeting in December. Line item of \$3,000 was added for Pastor Nominating Committee expenses. The Committee on Ministry has asked Session to develop a potential salary package for a future pastor along with prayerfully considering and developing a robust job description. The Personnel Committee will review prior Job Descriptions and provide a draft for review by Session. The Liaison from COM is to assist Personnel Committee in obtaining the Personnel Records. Outreach: Mission Giving: Session voted to continue Mission Giving grant to Missionary Rev. Mark Hall. His ministry is in Guatemala. He will be here to speak on Sunday, December 14th and will be given the check at that time.

Session Highlights (cont'd)

Ten members attended the Organic Outreach Conference. Session voted to purchase 10 tickets for 2015. Tickets purchased at discount of 50%. \$69. Members who wish to attend can reimburse the church for cost. Yae Kuwatani reported on progress of inventorying donated items for the Asian Crafts Fair. **Spiritual Growth:** Richard Marquez. Requests volunteers interested in leading Worship Service to contact him. **Dick Wong**, Commissioner to Presbytery of San Jose meetings, reported the Presbytery gets 52% of its income from giving by churches, 37% invested assets, 11% Synod Grants and 2% from General Assembly Grants. It will lose 45% of its membership as a result of churches leaving PC(USA). The Presbytery voted to approve dismissal of Mayflower Church in Pacific Grove. Voted to approve dissolving the pastoral relationship with Rev. Roberts and move to Member at Large status in the Presbytery. **Marian Kageyama** has advised Session she wishes to provide refreshments during Fellowship on January 4th to celebrate 88th birthday.

Vacant Pastor Position

Session has been in contact with the Commission on Ministry (COM) representatives of the Presbytery of San Jose. The COM has requested information to help determine which individuals would be suitable for El Estero as an interim pastor to guide the church in our search for a permanent pastor. Please continue to pray with the leadership that God's plan for El Estero will move us forward into the future.

El Estero Crafts and Food Fair

The Committee for the El Estero Crafts Fair has been working on inventorying and sorting the items collected for the festival. For those who were helping before and still have crafts they are working on, please contact Yae Kuwatani, Nora Shen, Marlene Sato or Naomi Pich. All who are willing to give us a hand with ideas and help are always welcomed. Information and future notices will forth-coming soon.

Nancy's Project

For many, many years El Estero Presbyterian Church has contributed to Nancy's Project (Nancy Costello's Migrant Worker program). This year the migrant workers have been hit hard financially...not as much work in the fields. Therefore, Nancy's Project decided to distribute Food Boxes this year instead of individual gifts. They felt that this would reach many more people and provide much needed food for the families.

The Deacons have collected and packaged personal and toiletry items to be distributed to the migrate workers for Christmas..


